## Creative Economy Project: Update on Regional Marketing Initiative

The Regional Marketing Initiative is a collaboration of Ruthland County municipalities, the Rutland Region Chamber of Commerce, and the Rutland Region Economic Development Corporation. The goal of the initiative is to grow the economy in our region.

Our town group, the Creative Economy Project, is involved with the Regional Marketing Initiative. Since the favorable vote on Town Meeting day to support the regional program, Kathy Letendre and Tom Hurcomb have met several times with the regional group. The regional group leaders Mary Cohen (Rutland Region Chamber of Commerce) and Lyle Jepson (Rutland Region Economic Development Corporation) also came to Middletown Springs and met with our Creative Economy group and our Planning Commission. Our aim is to have Middletown Springs and other small towns well represented in regional efforts like the Regional Marketing Plan.

The Regional Marketing Initiative's advertising agency is Mondo Mediaworks from Brattleboro. Their videographer visited Middletown Springs to take video footage at Sissy's, the Town Green, the school, and other town locations. They also visited other towns in the region, so we don't know if we will be included in the initial advertising videos, but it's a good start. We were glad to be included in their first round of visits.

The Regional Marketing Plan will be unveiled at the Rutland Chamber of Commerce Annual Meeting on October 19 at the Paramount Theater. Mondo Mediaworks will present the Marketing Plan details and advertising program at that time.

Saturday, October 7 will be the final Large Trash and Metal Collection event of 2017. This will be conducted at 577 West Street (Route 140) across from Parker Water Wells. Furniture, toys, small amounts of construction/demolition debris items are acceptable. No contractors, please. Hours will be from 6 am-noon.

Please note that while metal waste will be collected without fee, there will be a \$5 per vehicle load charge for non-metallic large trash items.

All items containing refrigerants (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, etc.) will be collected at Fort Dumpster only, and a separate disposal fee for handling the refrigerant material will be assessed.

## News from the School

Students and staff have had another great start to the school year. The Friends for Education with other community members put on the Community Breakfast for the opening day of school. A lot of work was done on the school over the summer. The last of the old carpet was replaced with new carpet squares, a new drop ceiling was installed in the main office, new wood chips were spread on the playground and a number of classrooms were painted. The school looked good for everyone's return!

Fifth grade students are again attending STAR-BASE for a five week science program. STARBASE Vermont has served students, teachers and schools since 1994. Their mission is to raise the interest and improve the knowledge and skills of youth in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). They provide an exciting activity-based curriculum involving hands-on STEM, teambuilding, and healthy choices. One of the most anticipated activities is that students have an opportunity to build and launch rockets. All students will also be attending Castleton State College for two free performances in the next few weeks.

Middletown Springs Elementary students continue to do well on the SBAC (Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium) assessment for reading and math. To supplement the student information from the spring SBAC, the school also does MAP (Measured Academic Progress) three times a year with all students. This provides a way throughout the year to monitor progress and identify academic needs. It is important to have multiple measures to show academic progress by the students.
