Donations of non-perishable food and fresh produce are always welcome. The Poultney Food Shelf is a 501(c)3 not-for profit.



Meeting the Author!

Middletown Springs kids made us proud! Twenty-five students from grades 4-6 and seven adults traveled by a Premier bus to Burlington to hear award-winning author Jacqueline Woodson give a talk. Some students had never been to Burlington, so the travel experience alone was an educational treat. In the auditorium, our group sat right up front; not only did we have an up-close and personal view of the author, we were pointed out to the audience as school kids who had traveled two hours during dinner time to get there!

Many of our questions, generated during the Inter-generational Discussion at the town library, were answered when Jacqueline had a Q&A time. Many of OUR students were able to ask the questions. Talking into a mic, in a large school auditorium, took courage and poise.

As part of the Vermont Humanities Council's fifteenth annual Vermont READS program the students read and thoroughly enjoyed the book, *Brown Girl Dreaming* by Jacqueline Woodson. Vermont READS is a statewide one-book community reading program sponsored by the Vermont Humanities Council and locally supported by the town library, the Friends of the Library, and the school. This year the Historical Society added their support to make this bus trip possible.

There are so many people to thank in this community for making this unforgettable experience a reality. Thanks to the Library for writing the grant and hosting an inter-generational discussion! Thanks to Friends of the Library for hosting and promoting the Vermont READS Program! Thanks to the Middletown Historical Society for their interest and financial help!
