Historical Society Receives Publication Award for Historic District Book

At the annual meeting of the League of Local Historical Societies and Museums held in Woodstock on October 27, the Vermont Historical Society presented the LLHS&M Awards recognizing the exceptional work being done by individuals and organizations throughout the state in collecting, preserving, and sharing Vermont's rich history. Eight organizational awards and five individual awards were presented this year.

The Middletown Springs Historical Society received an Award of Merit for Publications for the book, Middletown Springs Historic District, published in December 2017. Judges commented that it was "a beautiful, well put together publication and noted that it "updated an existing, well used resource in a new way."

Invitation for Proposals for 2018 Town Report

The Town of Middletown Springs invites any interested person or business to **submit a proposal for the layout and design** of the 2018 Town Report. An electronic copy of the 2017 Town Report is available on the Middletown Springs website, <u>middletownsprings.vt.gov</u>, or pick up a hard copy at the Town Clerk's office.

This project requires close coordination with the Town Clerk, members of the Selectboard, and other elected officials and volunteer organizations in gathering and organizing information. The selected vendor will need to scan and/or transcribe hard-copy documents for inclusion in the electronic file, as well as modify the format of Microsoft Word, Excel, and other files to fit the final layout plan. This will require visits to the Town Clerk's office to pick up documents as they become available and active e-mail access to receive electronic materials. Past years' layout and design work have taken approximately 35-50 hours.

It is expected that the selected vendor will deliver a print-ready electronic document to the Town's selected printing contractor during the first week of February 2019. The Town will be responsible for printing and mailing the final report by its deadline of February 22. Proposals should include a fixed-fee or hourly cost for layout, design, and coordination as described above; designate the layout/design software that they will use; and include at least one sample of a prior project they have completed that is similar in scope (either in paper or in PDF electronic version).

Proposals are due at the Middletown Springs Town Office by 4 pm on Friday, December 7, 2018. If you have any questions about this request for proposals, please contact Selectboard Chair Chris Fenton or Selectboard Clerk Herb Childress.

Newly Appointed Delinquent Tax Collector

On November 20, the Middletown Springs Selectboard **voted to appoint Debra House** as the Town's interim Delinquent Tax Collector, until an election for the position can be held at Town Meeting 2019.

From the Vermont Handbook for Collector of Delinquent Taxes: "The collector of delinquent taxes plays a vital role in ensuring that town property taxes are paid by all of the taxpayers of the town. It is the delinquent tax collector's job to notify taxpayers when their taxes are overdue, to make arrangements for late payments, and to take formal collection actions, including conducting tax sales of the property, when necessary. Finally, it is the obligation of the collector of delinquent taxes to keep records of all delinquent accounts and to provide an accounting of these records to the locally elected auditors for inclusion in the annual report of the town."

Property Tax payments for the 2nd Quarter of Fiscal Year 18/19 are due on or before Saturday, December 15, 2018. The Treasurer will be **in the**



Town Office on Saturday, December 15, 2018, from 9 am to 2 pm to collect tax payments. Or, Mail your payment to: Town Treasurer, PO Box 1022, Middletown Springs, VT 05757.

Envelopes must be postmarked 12/15/18 or earlier to be considered on time. **Tax payments received or postmarked AFTER 12/15 are considered LATE.** Late payments will incur interest of 1% per month for 3 months, and 1.5 % per month, for each month thereafter until payment is remitted.
