Zookeepers Rock Out for Library

The Middletown Springs Public Library has an out-of-this-world event for rock music and poetry lovers. The 2019 Tammie Award "Best Vermont Rock Album" winner, David Rosane & the Zookeepers, will give a benefit concert for the Library on **Friday**, **July 26**, **at 7 pm**, outside at the Middletown Springs Elementary School. **Gates will open at 5:30 pm** for those who would like to picnic before the concert. Suggested do-nation is \$10 or a free-will offering.

All summer David Rosane & the Zookeepers are touring the state to support Vermont libraries and shine a light on their pivotal role in our communities. "What started out last year as a grassroots effort has blossomed into a statewide project," said frontman David Rosane.

This year's tour title is "**Across the Zoo-niverse**," paralleling with the Summer Reading Program theme being used by libraries all over the country: "A Universe of Stories" and the 50th anniversary of Apollo 11 and the moonwalk. The Library Trustees, along with the Friends of the Library, have an entertaining space-related evening planned.

All donations raised at the show will go to the Library to support its programs and needs.

Vermont Poet Laureat Chard deNiord will open the show at 7 pm and David Rosane & the Zookeepers will take the stage at 7:30 pm. A resident of Westminster West, Mr. deNiord's poetry is funny, poignant, and spiritual.

The Zookeepers are a fringe protest-band playing for causes, an international collective of musical heavy hitters led by Paris-based power rocker David Rosane, who also has a gentle side. The band features Don Sinclair on bass and guitar and Jennifer Grossi on vocals, synthesizer, and percussion.

Stellar desserts, crater 'corn, and lunar beverages (sorry, no moonshine) will be available for purchase. In case of inclement weather, the concert will move into the school's multipurpose room.

Public Review Meeting West Street Town Property

The Town has received a small grant from VTRANS to conduct a **study of the feasibility of using** the 577 West Street property (where we hold Large Waste Day) for some town functions: a highway garage, salt and sand storage, and/or the relocation of the transfer station. The Selectboard and other community members have been working with Craig Jewett of Otter Creek Engineering to develop alternative proposals to put Town functions at that site while still being environmentally responsible with regard to the adjoining Poultney River and its riparian corridor.

The Selectboard and Otter Creek Engineering will hold a public review meeting to discuss the alternatives under consideration at **6 pm on Thursday**, **July 11**, at the Town Office. Come hear the ideas that are on the table for preserving the health of the river, improving the function of the highway department and transfer station, and remediating some of the environmental problems created by the current salt and transfer station conditions. We'd value your input as we take this important next step for our town.

Tour de Slate:

Bike Ride to End Addiction

Addiction has touched the lives of countless friends, neighbors,

co-workers, and classmates. For some, it's too close to home. For others, it's "someone else's" story.

In Middletown Springs and down the quiet roads of the Slate Valley, it's a story of redemption. It's a story of riding bikes to raise money to support the recovery of friends, neighbors -- and our own family members -- at the second annual Tour de Slate "riding to end addiction" bike ride.

This year's Tour de Slate through the Slate Valley of Vermont and eastern New York will take place on **Saturday, August 3, 2019,** to raise money to end addiction. 100% of this fund-raiser's net proceeds go directly to cover the expenses of men, women, and teens ready to turn their lives around and break the chains of addiction at Teen Challenge Vermont.

Teen Challenge Vermont is a 15-month, residential facility with an admissions office on West Street

Note from the Town Treasurer



Property tax bills for the new fiscal year, 2019/2020, will be delivered to you in August. Your first quarterly tax payment for the new cycle will

be due on or before September 16 (since the 15th is a Sunday).

IMPORTANT ADDRESS INFORMATION: If your mailing address has changed or needs updating, please contact Sally Achey, Lister Chair. Address adjustments are completed through the Grand List system, which is maintained by the Listers.

Sally will update your address so that your tax bill (which originates in the Grand List system) is mailed to the correct address. Please contact Sally ASAP at mtslisters@vermontel.net.

Homestead Rebates: FYI - The State of Vermont will download to Middletown Springs, a list of homestead rebates that will automatically be applied to your tax bill, if you are eligible. And, if eligible, you will receive a letter from the State of Vermont indicating the amount of your rebate.

Please note that the Town does NOT determine the amount, if any, of your rebate. This is a state function. You need to contact the state if you have any questions.

in Rutland City. No one is ever turned away because of financial circumstances or inability to pay, which is why fund-raising is so crucial.

Last year's event was a huge success on many levels. One participant in the 2018 ride said, "Of all the fund-raising bike rides I've participated in, Teen Challenges - Tour de Slate was the most enjoyable. Where else can you experience such great mountain scenery while supporting a wonderful cause? For me the highlight came at the conclusion of the ride. Great food and personal stories of youngsters finding a new life in recovery from drug addiction and alcoholism."

The event is designed so that there is a ride route for everyone. There are three road routes, including a metric century ride (100 km, 63.4 mi) and also a family-friendly rails/trails route. Volunteers and rest stops will be positioned along the way. All rides start and end on the Green in Middletown Springs. Riders will receive a Tour de Slate T-shirt and a drawstring backpack goodie bag.

An authentic Indian chicken curry dinner will be served (free of charge for riders and volunteers) at the finish line after the ride. The grill will also be ready to fix hamburgers and hot dogs.

Organizers hope this year's ride will raise more than last year's \$17,633.59. All those funds directly supported the care, clinical counseling, educational and career services for clients at Teen Challenge.
