## Town Office Progress

The new Middletown Springs Town Office is nearing completion, with a projected move-in date at the end of September. The new building will house the Town's vital records, as well as the offices of the Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, and Board of Listers. A large public meeting room, a small conference room, two bathrooms and a kitchenette will round out the public spaces. It will soon be possible for more than one group to meet at a time, and more easily accommodate the work of title searchers, surveyors, and other professionals.

Thanks to the remarkable work of our architect Geoff Metcalfe (Keefe \& Wesner Architects, Bennington) and our general contractors John Crossman and Leo Fairbanks (Naylor and Breen, Brandon) and their subcontractors, we've seen the building come together within budget and within schedule. Special thanks to Peter Stevenson, the Town's volunteer construction liaison who's been on site nearly every working day to oversee work and consider small changes.

## Office Space for Rent

Are you thinking of expanding or relocating your office-based business?

Office space will be available in early October at the Middletown Springs Historical Society building, On the Green at 10 Park Ave. Rented as the Town Office since 1980, the 440 sq. ft. space was remodeled in 1998 and subdivided to create a secure room with an antique fire resistant safe.

The main room has built-in shelving and a mini-split heating and cooling system. Interior doors provide access to the building's accessible restroom and an alternate accessible entrance from the rear of the building. The office is wired for an optional security system through Countryside Lock and Alarm.

The monthly rent of $\$ 500$ includes heat and electricity. A lease and security deposit are required.

## A Note from the Town Treasurer

New property tax bills for fiscal year 23/24 will be mailed to you by mid-August. Please SAVE your bill for future reference. Even if your mortgage company pays your taxes, you will need this document when you file your April income taxes OR refinance OR sell your property.

Included on your tax bill will be a homestead rebate IF you applied and qualified for it. The State of Vermont determines if you are eligible for a rebate.

IMPORTANT: If your mailing address has changed, please advise. Also, if you have not received your new bill by mid-August, please email mtstreasurer@vermontel.net (or call 235-3256) and confirm your name, parcel address and mailing address.

Mark your calendar: your first payment for the new tax year will be due on or before September 15, 2023.
